


What is a COST action?



• **COST Actions are networks** integrating externally funded research, with a minimum of 5 participating COST countries. They receive a financial contribution based on a 4-year joint work programme for:


- Scientific/Working Group meetings
- Workshops and Seminars
- Short Term Scientific Missions (STSMs)
- Training Schools
- Dissemination activities





How is a COST action set up?










COST strengths

- all countries






COST in Malta



Since 2010, Malta's participation in COST continued to increase several times fold. In 2020, Malta participated in 200 Actions out of 291 Actions running at any time of the year (69%).

Since 2010, Malta's participation in **COST** continued to increase several times fold, compared to other EU countries, across all the domains









How can I participate in COST?




- Each country has different procedures
- But basically each nomination is on a country basis made by the CNC, on behalf of the COST managing authority, usually the Science Council. In Malta this is MCST.



- For more details on action check MOU





COST application form



- MCST Application for COST
- CV is important (2 pages only please)
- Application checked by CNC
- Applicant must show how the action is relevant to his/her area of interest and expertise
- If more than 2 applicants, then priority is given to applicants from different institutes/departments to ensure the interdisciplinary of COST actions





COST application process



- Recommendation forwarded to MCST board for approval
- CNC informs applicant of approval
- CNC uploads applicant details on e-COST website
- Applicant receives link to accept nomination and upload details on e-COST
- Whole process takes around 2 weeks

MC members: changes to nomination processs



- Up to 2 representatives per COST Full or Cooperating Member, nominated by CNC following application
- Nominations now must be done by CNC before the first Management Committee meeting (MC1)
- After MC1 there needs to be tacit approval by the MC. To be given within 4 weeks of request
- Everyone who wants to join an Action (including the MC candidate) as from now for the new Actions, should register for WGs in a specific COST action as from 1st November 2021.
- The MC Chair, Vice-Chair and Grant Holder Scientific Representative need to be MCs.



MC members: changes to role of MC substitutes



Substitution of MC Members

- On 1st November, MC substitutes will be removed from the Action website and e-COST and applications for permanent substitutes for COST MC members will no longer be possible.
- There may be substitutes nominated for a limited time or specific meeting.
- Among the WG members affiliated in the same COST Member or Specific Organisation.
- They can be nominated by the MC directly when necessary, without the need to go through the relevant country COST CNC.
- If substitutes are involved in a Working Group (WG), as from 1st November they will be transferred to that WG and will appear on the Action website (as WG member).



Working group (WG) members: changes in role




- Researchers who are not MC members may request to apply as Working Group (WG)
 experts. This is done directly from the COST Action webpage.
- Researchers can apply from now as WG experts for the new Actions (but please note that these applications will only be reviewed after the first MC meeting).
- The researcher applies directly without the need to go through the relevant country COST CNC, using the following steps.
- NB: A WG member is not reimbursed for participating in COST Action activities. This
 remains a decision of the MC under the COST eligibility framework.

- Click on the "apply" button on the Action webpage








Working group (WG) members: how to apply

- Fill in the online application. This will be reviewed by the Management Committee after the first MC meeting.
- Please note that you need to create an e-cost profile to be able to fill in this form.
- The form also gives the option to declare your availability to join the MC or act as a substitute if needed for a short period of time.







New position: Grant Awarding Coordinator



- New position to coordinate the opening of calls, evaluation procedures and grants to support the following networking activities:
 - Mobility of researchers and innovators
 - Attendance of conferences organised by 3rd parties
 - Capacity building (limited to young researchers and innovators from ITC or NNC)
 - Dissemination meeting related to COST Actions' work and results. (NEW)





Reimbursement of individuals

MC Meeting:

- Open to any relevant participant (even if not MC member) as attendee.
- MC can decide to reimburse only 1 MC member per country.

Invited Speakers:

- No more limit of 4 per event
- Concept substituted by ad hoc participant


